Economics

The classes of 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 will not be affected by the transition. They will face the same major requirements that have been in place for some time (11 units of graded economics courses; 3 of the 11 at the 300-level; Econ 102, 200, 201, and 209 required).

The department is planning to change its probability, statistics, and econometrics courses for the class entering next fall. But we will offer Econ 209 and 210 in their current forms for three more years to accommodate those currently attending Vassar. If someone takes more than four years to complete their degree, we will have to make some sort of special arrangement.

Classes of 2023 and beyond will be on the new major requirements.
